

Milnerton Shooting Association: Defensive shooting.

This shoot is now officially a MSA club shoot and will count towards dedicated status and towards medals and trophies for the end of year.

We are only running one class "Carry" for the medals and trophies for this year and if we get enough interest and helpers, we will be expanding the classes to Standard and Open Class as well. You are welcome to bring your

Rules for the Carry Class as follows:

1. All competitors must be checked for safe draw and fire competency and a certificate issued prior to them being allowed to draw and fire on the range. (This can be done on the day of competition and if passed then will be allowed to draw and fire)
2. All MSA and WCSU safety rules and protocols will apply.
3. Range officers' commands will be adhered to at all times.
4. Firearms are 9mm parabellum or bigger with a barrel length not exceeding 4 inches for example Glock 19.
5. Firearms needs to be carried concealed ie the same way you would carry every day.

Rules for the Standard Class as follows:

1. Must fit in a box with magazine inserted of 225mm x 150mm x 45mm deep.
2. Typical firearms is Glock 17,34, Z88, Beretta 92, Colt 45, Vector SP1. No red dot sights. Open sights only

Rules for the open class as follows:

1. Unlimited ie red dots allowed no fitment in a box so your typical "race gun."

Sportsmanship:

This is high on our priority, so it is expected that a competitor shoot at least major factor loads. If you are found to cheat and use sub-par loads your score won't count and this will be at the discretion of the range officer.

Please try and bring at least two magazines preferably three and as many rounds as you would like as you can run the course a few times if you want. The course of fire is generally between 15 and 30 rounds depending on the day.

We generally start around between 08:15 and 8:30 latest depending on how many people arrive to help with the set up.
